 - o Data Science, M.P.S: Approved
 - The course ENMG 652 (Management, Leadership, and Communication) isn't
 part of the Data Science program's core curriculum and poses scheduling
 challenges due to high demand. To address this, the program introduced a
 new course, DATA 607: Leadership in Data Science, recently approved by
 the Graduate Council, as a substitute without altering credit requirements.
 - o Atmospheric Physics, Ph.D.: Approved
 - The program will introduce a new required course, PHYS 623 (Introduction to Atmospheric Radiation), to enhance student exposure in atmospheric physics, aiding in exam preparation and research readiness. This addition, discussed and approved by the physics department faculty, will result in a reduction of required electives from 5 to 4 while maintaining the same total credit requirements. PHYS 623 was recently approved by the Graduate Council as a new course.
