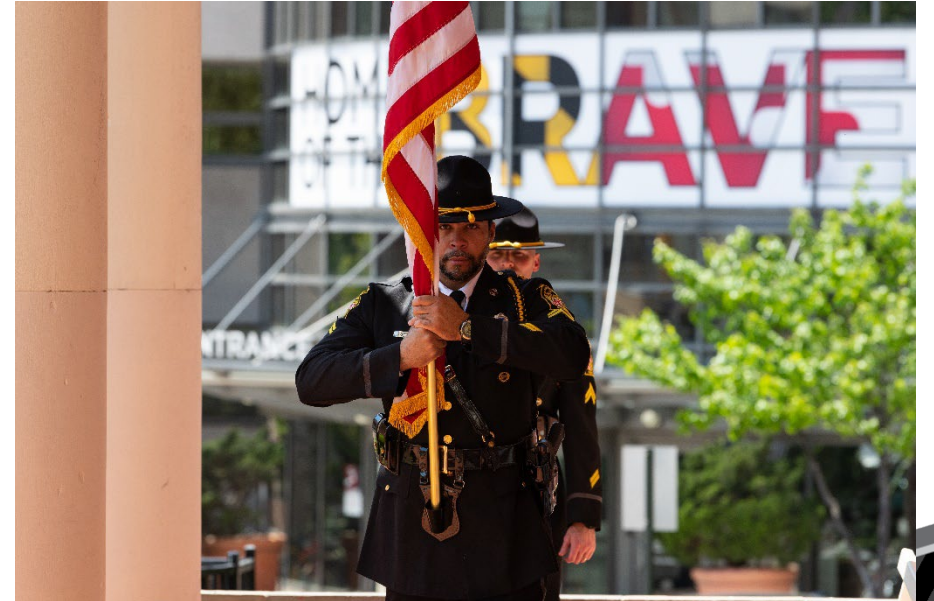

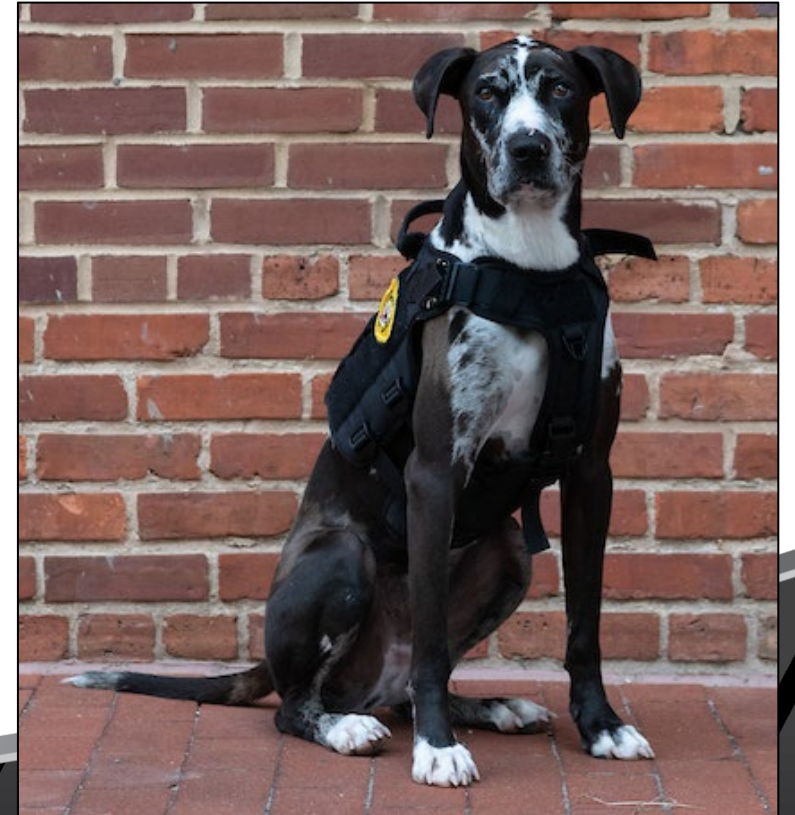

 - Request through the UMB Mobile App



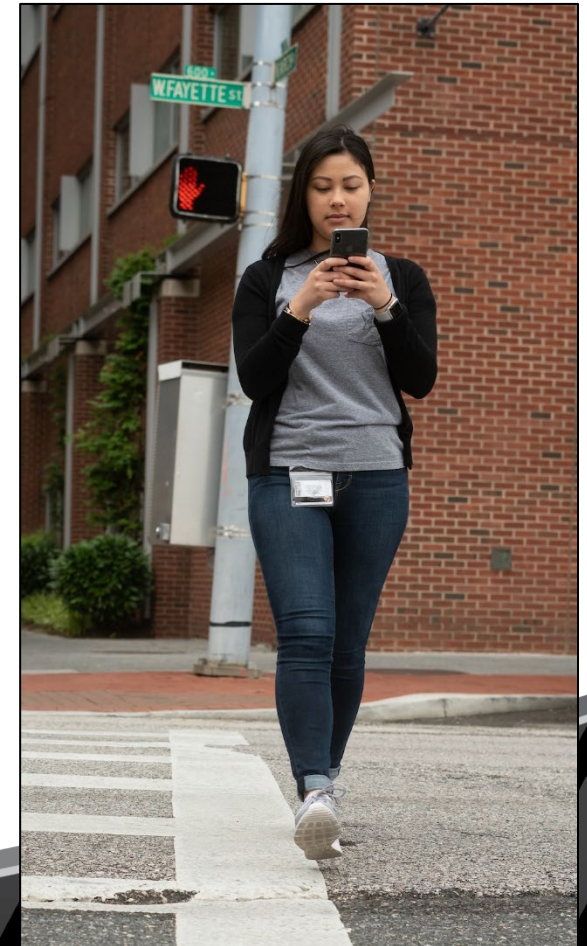
Emergency Blue Light Phones

- There are 31 Blue Light Phones at UMB
- It's not a panic button!
- Push the red button to speak with a police communications operator (PCO)
- Tell the PCO:
 - Your emergency
 - Your location (the number on the phone)



Safety is a Community Effort

- Put away phones and headphones
- Avoid wearing or displaying valuables
- Walk along well-lit paths; Avoid alleys
- Travel in groups
- Don't let someone "tailgate" into a UMB building
- If you need help, go into a UMB building and talk to a security officer



If you are the victim of a crime...

- Remain calm – **give them what they want**
- Call **911** and tell the dispatcher:
 - What happened
 - When and where the incident occurred
 - Suspect description:
 - Number of suspects; Gender, race, age, approximate height, hair color/style, distinctive characteristics (tattoos, scars), clothing
 - Direction of travel
 - Vehicle description

Homelessness: Panhandling

- Homelessness/panhandling is not a crime
 - If you choose to give: avoid bringing out your wallet. Consider giving food, clothing, water, or small change from your pocket.
 - If you choose not to give: say “sorry, no” and move on
 - A smile and a kind word go a long way, and it’s free!
- Aggressive panhandling is against the law
 - Walk away or ask the person to stop in a clear, calm voice
 - If you feel threatened, call for help from passersby
