Based at the University of Maryland-Baltimore in the School of Graduate Studies, PALLA was founded in 2019, with a mission to advance PA education, research, policy, and practice in Maryland and beyond. We support and enhance PA programs, particularly in the areas of faculty and preceptor development, clinical site recruitment, student success, accreditation, and ongoing programmatic quality improvement. PALLA is a collaborative that seeks to strengthen and promote the Maryland PA workforce by increasing faculty capacity to educate the next generation of PA program graduates. Our vision is to create an inclusive learning community dedicated to excellence in education and professional development. As a policy institute, PALLA performs research and advocacy on crucial topics in health professions education, health services and systems science. Leveraging both virtual and face-to-face teaching, PALLA offers a PA faculty pipeline fellowship, and preceptor academy that addresses some of the critical barriers in the development of the PA workforce in Maryland and beyond.

Rural Maryland Council Grant

Key aspects of the grant:

Develop a centralized clinical coordinating center through a series of rural focused workshops and a 6-month formalized fellowship program focusing on effective precepting and mentorship.

Deploy PA students in rural areas under the mentorship of our trained preceptors.

Recruit pre-health aspiring future health professions from rural communities and match them with rural preceptors
